CAPT's Fall Presentation is backed by two major bodies of research...

...the **ARC Model** and the **ADOPTS Program** both support this presentation.

1) The ARC Model was developed, incorporating the latest brain research, by the team at The Trauma Center in Brookline, MA (Bessel van der Kolk, MD; Medical Director). Guildford Press just published (March, 2010) *Treating Traumatic Stress in Children and Adolescents: How to Foster Resilience through Attachment, Self-Regulation, and Competency* (ISBN 978-1-60623-625-3), by Margaret E. Blaustein and Kristine M. Kinniburgh, developer of the ARC Model. A shorter summary of the ARC model, by the same authors, can be found in the *Psychiatric Annals* for May, 2005, pages 424-430. [This project was funded, in part, by the National Child Traumatic Stress Network initiative administered by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA).]

2) Bethany Christian Services, with a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, adapted the ARC Model to serve the needs of their agency and named it the **ADOPTS Therapeutic Program**. Bethany, an adoption agency with branches in many cities of America, has used this structured, time-limited protocol since 2004. Assessments of clients conducted prior to starting the program, immediately after, and 12 months later demonstrate that this therapeutic program helps large numbers of children and families. Bethany publishes success rates ranging between 88% and 100% for specific goals. **Our presenters, Amy Brace and Rachel Kowatch, are part of the team that developed and administers the ADOPTS model for Bethany.** Ms. Brace, LMSW, ACSW is the therapist/supervisor for the Family Counseling Center at the Grand Rapids branch of Bethany Christian Services, and President of the Michigan Association for Play Therapy. Rachel Kowatch, LMSW, is the Coordinator for the Bethany Christian Services ADOPTS program. Both have extensive experience as presenters. [Learn More](#)
