**Helping Kids in Crisis:
The Play Therapist's Guide to Crisis
Intervention**

Workshop Description:

Helping Kids in Crisis: The Play Therapist's Guide to Crisis Intervention

Often, children and youth come for play therapy following a traumatic event or stressor that has overwhelmed a family's resources. Sometimes those children and youth become involved with emergency services, such as a hospital emergency department, or with other first responders. Understanding crises from a child's point of view is needed in order to effectively respond. This workshop will examine the role of play therapy in stabilizing a child during a crisis and reducing traumatic stress afterward. We will learn play therapy techniques and activities that are useful for crisis intervention.

Workshop Learning Objectives:

1. Recognize what constitutes a crisis and when a crisis intervention is needed.
2. Recognize the immediate impact of a crisis or traumatic event on the child's stress response system.
3. Assess your readiness to offer effective play therapy interventions in chaotic, emotionally charged conditions.
4. Utilize medical and legal knowledge for appropriate crisis response and intervention.
5. Apply play therapy principles as part of the first response to a crisis.
6. Utilize play therapy techniques to help children and teens through a crisis.



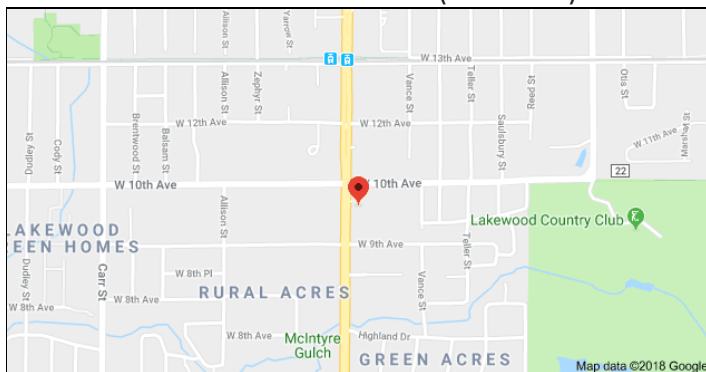
